**4th Sunday in Ordinary Time
January 29, 2012**

As Christians, it is good to reflect upon our basic beliefs and opinions. We have all heard the saying, "You can't teach an old dog new tricks." I never liked that saying. I would like to think we are all open to looking at things in a new spirit, to examine our basic presuppositions, either to grow into a deeper understanding of them, or to detect faulty logic and so be set free from old deceptions. There is a lot of discord in our land, lots of disagreements. Somebody has to be right, and somebody wrong, or maybe we are all a little wrong, but we can't all be right in the same way. So it is important to have a great love for truth, and be willing to change and conform our lives and our minds to that truth. This is the only path to peace.

Prophets do not often come into our world. They are a relatively rare phenomenon. When they do arrive, they are often rejected. Why? Because we do not have a great love of truth, rather we like to stay in our comfort zone. Change, despite the rhetoric, is not something we readily embrace. Moses told the people in today's first reading, "Your God will raise up for you a prophet...to him you must listen." In the Gospel we see this prophet, Jesus, speaking with authority, working miracles. But many would reject him. As a result, Jerusalem was destroyed about 40 years after his crucifixion. There are prophets in our midst today. Do we know who they are? Do we listen to them? Or are we so attached to our old ways, that we can not detect our faulty logic, can not create a consensus in truth and justice that would bring us peace? Let us pray for the gift of Wisdom. Wisdom and truth break down barriers and bring us together. Truth is one, and those who have it, experience unity. May we hear the prophets in our midst, and not be afraid of them.

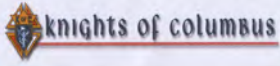


